

2018 Bond Program Monthly Update

Harris County Commissioners Court – March 2022



It was a busy month for the Harris County Flood Control District with 5 community engagement meetings including:

- SIMS BAYOU WATERSHED- C144-00-00 Conveyance Improvements project
- ARMAND BAYOU WATERSHED- Genoa Red Bluff Stormwater Detention Basin
- GALVESTON BAY WATERSHED- Deer Creek F212-00-00 Stormwater Conveyance Improvement project
- CYPRESS CREEK WATERSHED- Cypress Creek Watershed Implementation Program
- LITTLE CYPRESS CREEK WATERSHED- Little Cypress Creek L100 Stormwater Conveyance Improvements and Mueschke East Stormwater Detention Basin

We also celebrated \$9.95 million in federal funding for a stormwater detention basin in the Brays Bayou watershed. Allocated for the Meyergrove Stormwater Detention Basin in Brays Bayou, the partner funds will be used for the design and construction of the 7.5-acre stormwater detention basin located near the intersection of N. Braeswood Blvd and Interstate Highway 610. The funding was allocated through the FY22 government spending bill and goes toward a project in Congresswoman Lizzie Fletcher's district (TX-07). This project is one of six "Community Project Funding" requests approved by Congress totaling more than \$41 million.

We also broke ground on two stormwater detention basin projects - K120-00-00-E001 Harris County Municipal Utility District (MUD) 249 agreement and K120-03-00-E001 Z-02 Partnership with Harris County Water Control & Improvement District No. 110 and Harris County MUD 249. The K120-00-00-E001 Harris County Municipal Utility District (MUD) 249 basin is designed to take in and temporarily hold approximately 37 acre-feet, or more than 12 million gallons, of stormwater during heavy rain events. K120-03-00-E001 Z-02 Partnership with Harris County Water Control & Improvement District (HCWCID) No. 110 and Harris County MUD 249 project is a tri-party stormwater detention basin expansion project (Flood Control District, MUD 249 and WCID 110) located about a 1/4 mile north of the first project.



Flood Control District Celebrates Federal Funding for Critical Flood Risk Reduction Project (March 2022)

Earmarked funding by Congresswoman Lizzie Fletcher to fund stormwater detention basin in Brays Bayou.

On March 23, 2022, the Harris County Flood Control District attended an event at the site of the Meyergrove Stormwater Detention Basin in Brays Bayou to celebrate \$9.95 million in federal funding for the project. The funding was allocated through the FY22 government spending bill and goes toward a project in Congresswoman Lizzie Fletcher's district (TX-07).

The partner funds will be used for the design and construction of the 7.5-acre stormwater detention basin located near the intersection of Braeswood Drive and Interstate Highway 610. Alongside Harris County Flood Control District Executive Director Dr. Tina Petersen and Congresswoman Fletcher were Harris County Commissioner Rodney Ellis, Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner and Houston City Council members Abbie Kamin, David Robinson and Sallie Alcorn.

"This community has been impacted by a number of serious flood events over the last decade, and this project will be able to provide much-needed flood mitigation to residents," said Petersen. "We are grateful for Congresswoman Fletcher delivering these funds and for all of our federal partners advocating for these critical efforts in D.C. on behalf of Harris County."

The Meyergrove Stormwater Detention Basin is currently in the design stage of the project lifecycle. Once final design is approved and complete, construction is anticipated to start in Fall 2022 and be completed by Spring 2023.

Construction Update for Drainage Repairs in the Buffalo Bayou Watershed Basin (March 2022)

In spring 2022, the Flood Control District will begin a channel maintenance project along HCFCD Unit# W167-04-00 from Chatterton Drive to approximately 3,100 feet downstream. The project will address the channel conveyance capacity issues and restore the channel back to its original design capacity.

Construction equipment will access the work area via N. Dairy Ashford Road and Chatterton Drive. Motorists are urged to be alert to truck traffic when passing near construction access points and along truck routes. The Flood Control District appreciates your patience through the

Groundbreaking for Two Partnership Projects in the Cypress Creek Watershed (March 2022)

K120-00-00-E001 Harris County MUD 249

An agreement regarding a detention basin expansion project between MUD 249 and the Harris County Flood Control District. Construction recently started on this partnership project within the limits of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 249 to build stormwater detention that will:


- Mitigate for future drainage improvements in existing subdivisions
- Provide flood risk reduction in the Cypress Creek watershed

The project is being managed by Harris County MUD 249 and includes the construction of a stormwater detention basin on a 6.810-acre site near the junction of Lemm Gully K120-00-00 and its tributary Wunsche Gully K120-03-00, north of Cypresswood Drive between Interstate Highway 45 and the Hardy Toll Road. The basin is designed to take in and temporarily hold approximately 37 acre-feet, or more than 12 million gallons of stormwater during heavy rain events. The Flood Control District contributed approximately \$777,000 in 2018 Bond funding toward the project, under Bond ID Z-02 for partnership projects. Harris County MUD 249 spent more than \$610,000 to purchase the right-of-way from the Flood Control District and contributed nearly \$165,000 toward design and construction, plus additional right-of-way.

K120-03-00-E001 Z-02 Partnership with Harris County Water Control & Improvement District No. 110 and Harris County 249

K120-03-00-E001 Z-02 Partnership with Harris County Water Control & Improvement District (HCWCID) No. 110 and Harris County MUD 249 project is a tri-party detention basin expansion project (Flood Control District, MUD 249 and WCID 110) which is about a 1/4 mile north of the first project. HCWCID 110 and Harris County MUD 249 each own a basin which are adjacent to each other, and each have a maintenance berm that they share. The purpose of the project is to remove the common berm to obtain additional volume in the combined detention basin for flooding reduction. The additional volume due to the project is 12.2 acre-feet which is approximately 3.9 million gallons.

2018 Bond Program Master Schedule






















