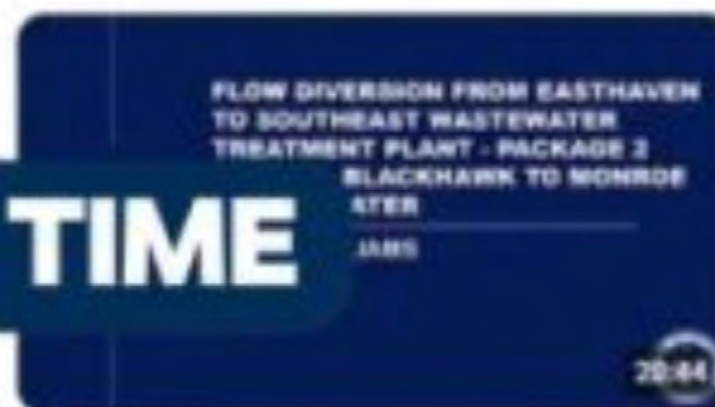

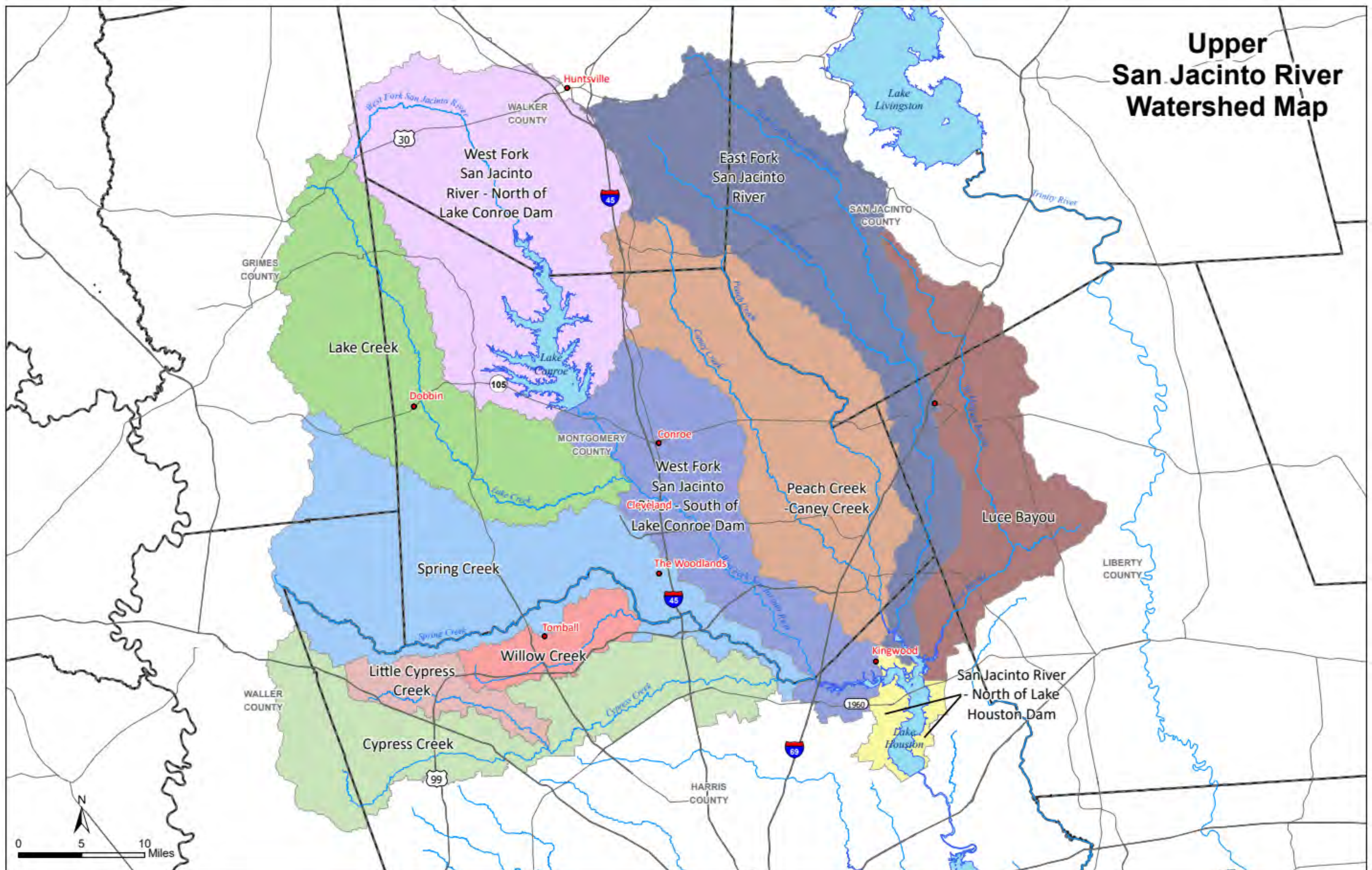

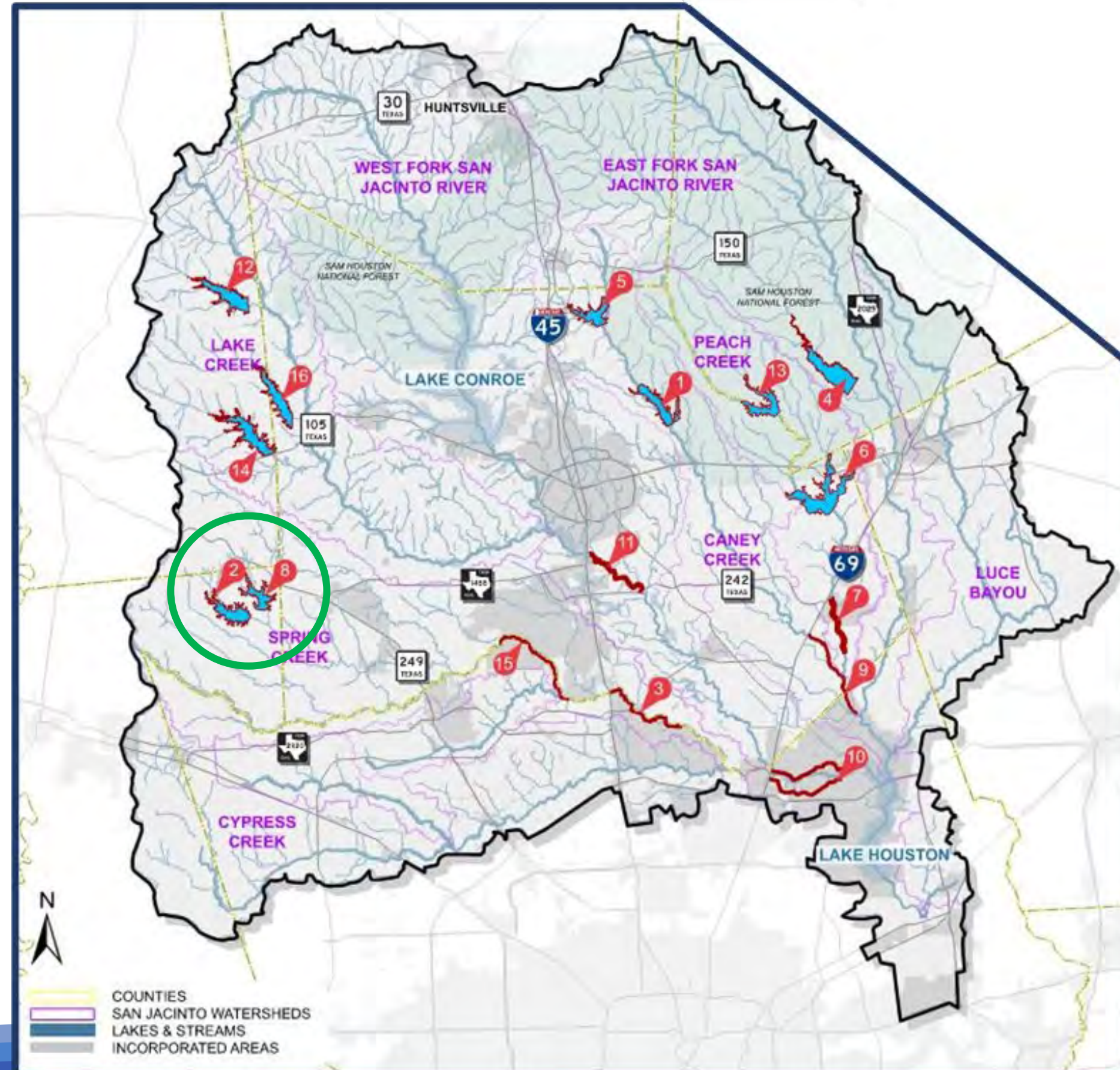
San Jacinto Master Drainage Plan

3,000 SQUARE MILES OF STUDY AREA

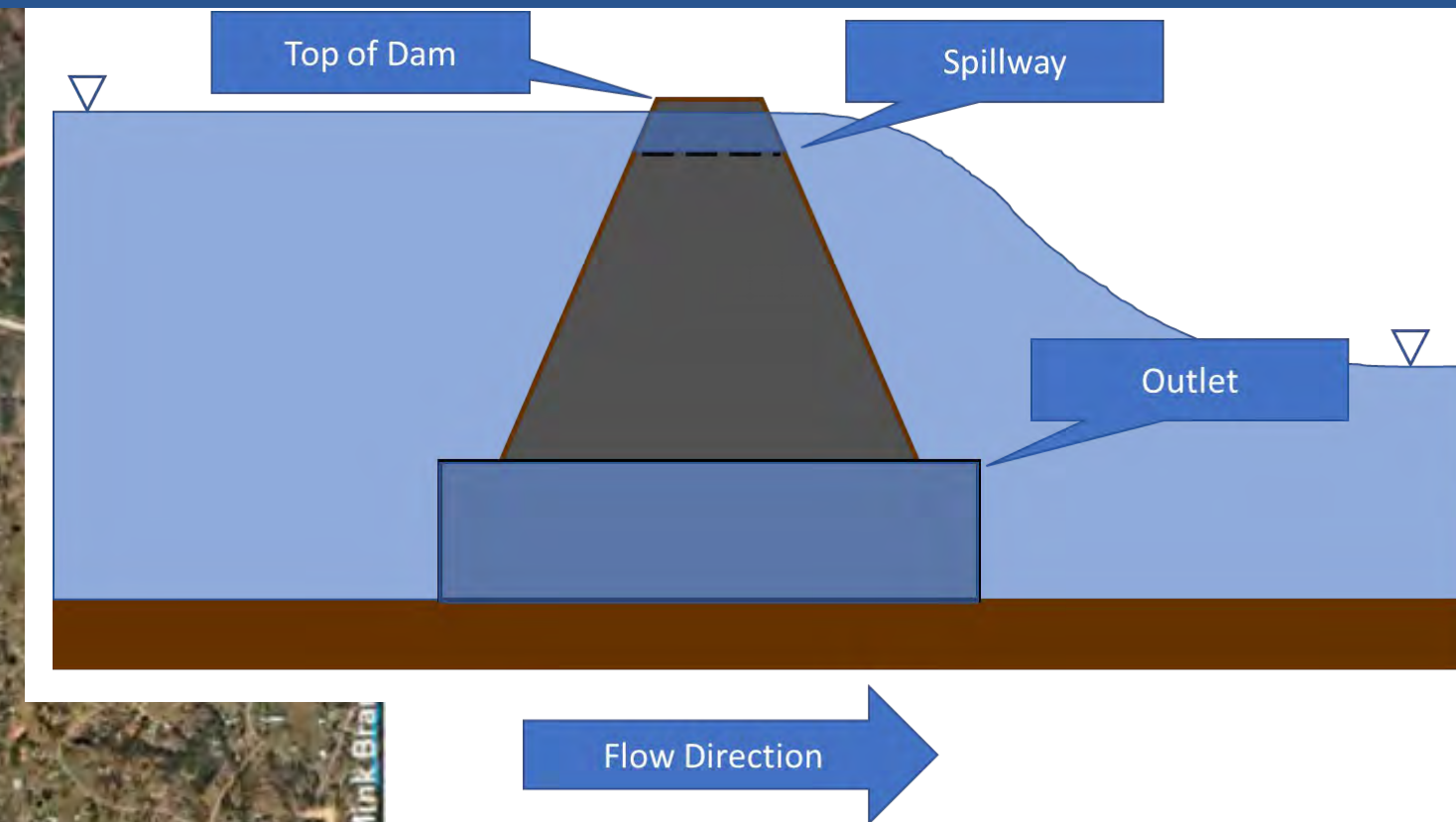
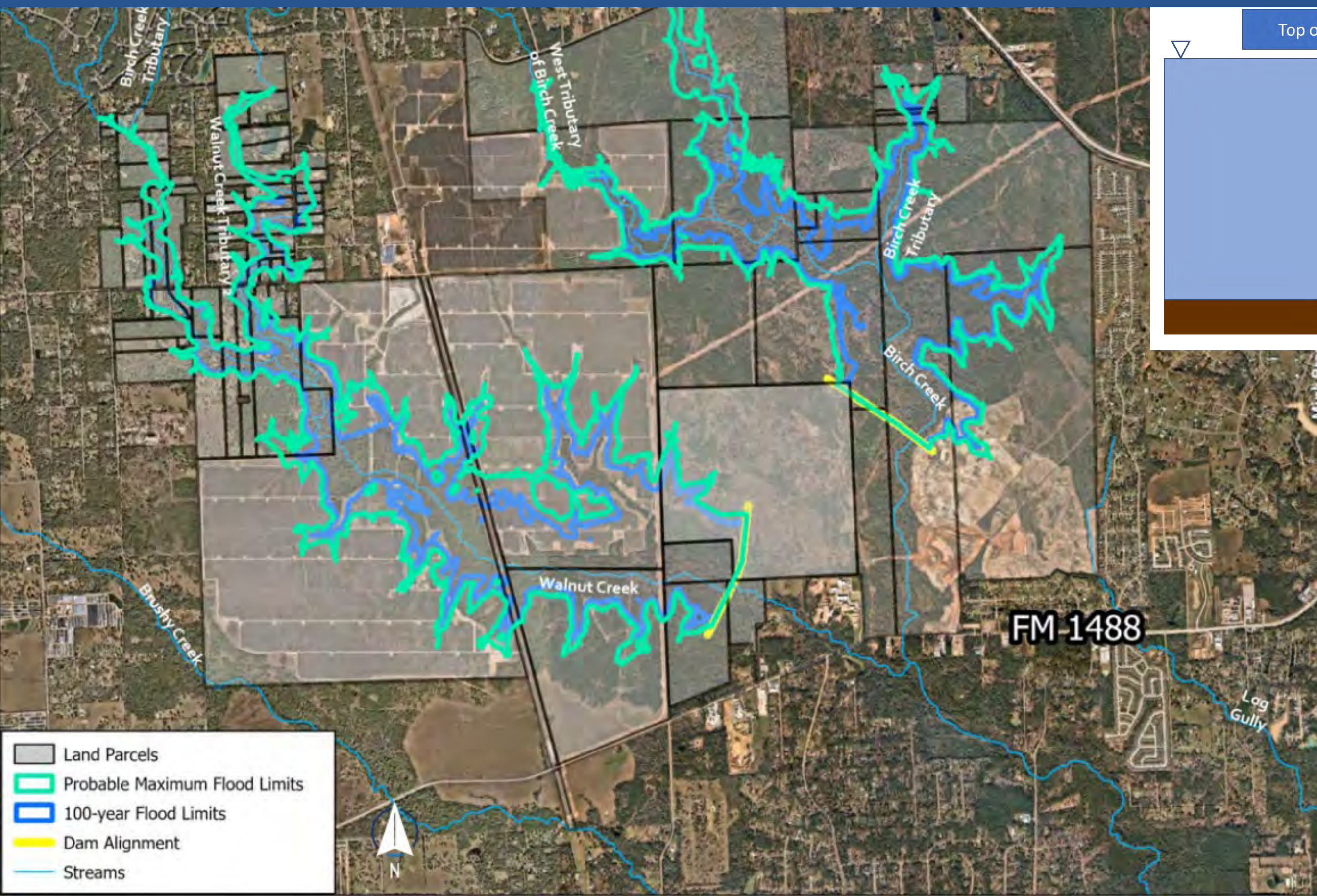
The watershed for the streams to be studied covers an expanse of nearly 3,000 square miles, located in seven different counties:

- Grimes County
- Harris County
- Liberty County
- Montgomery County
- San Jacinto County
- Walker County
- Waller County

The study includes approximately 535 miles of stream, including West Fork San Jacinto River, East Fork San Jacinto River, San Jacinto River, Lake Creek, Cypress Creek, Little Cypress Creek, Spring Creek, Willow Creek, Caney Creek, Peach Creek, Luce Bayou, Tarkington Bayou, and Jackson Bayou.

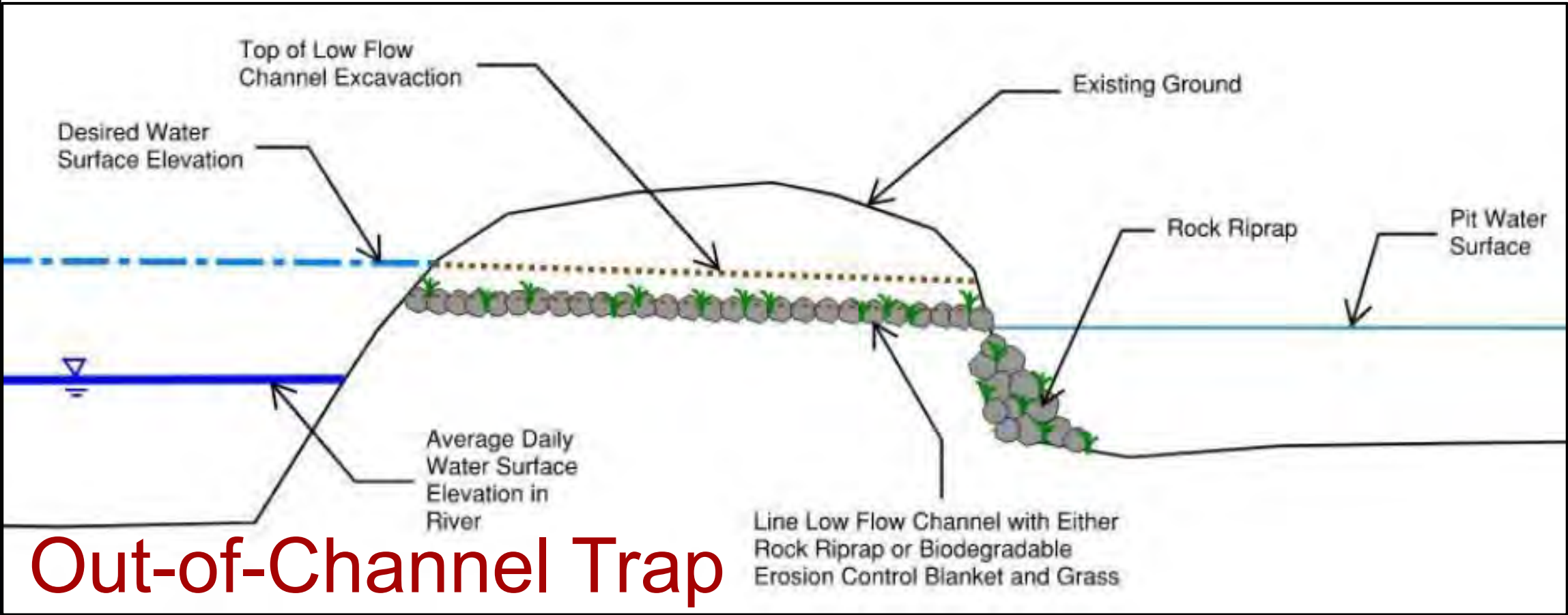
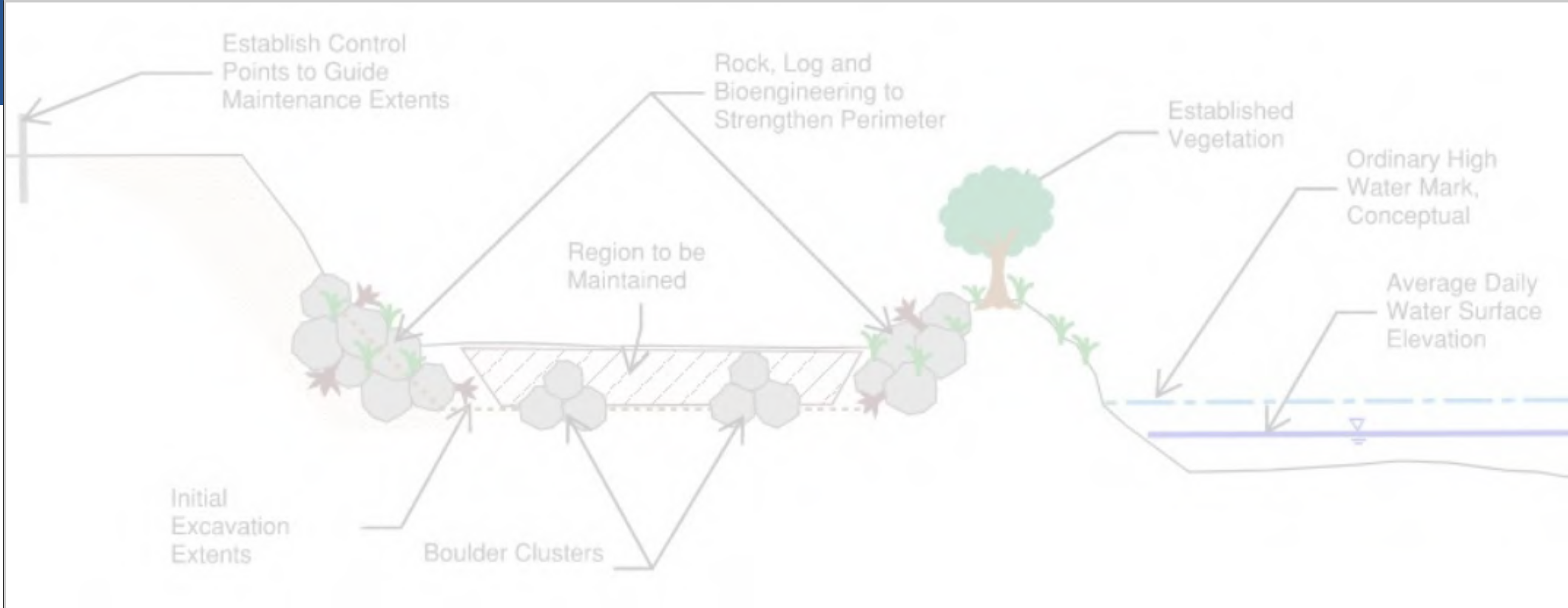
Sand Trap Pilot Project



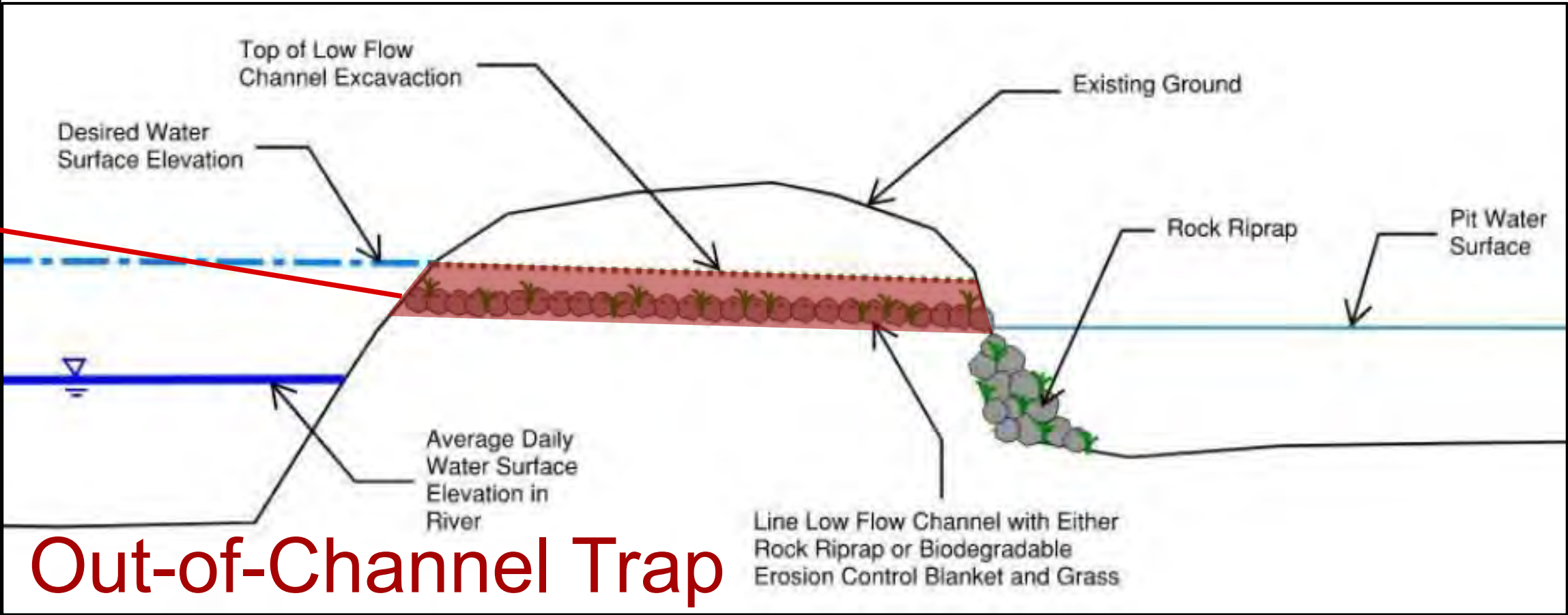
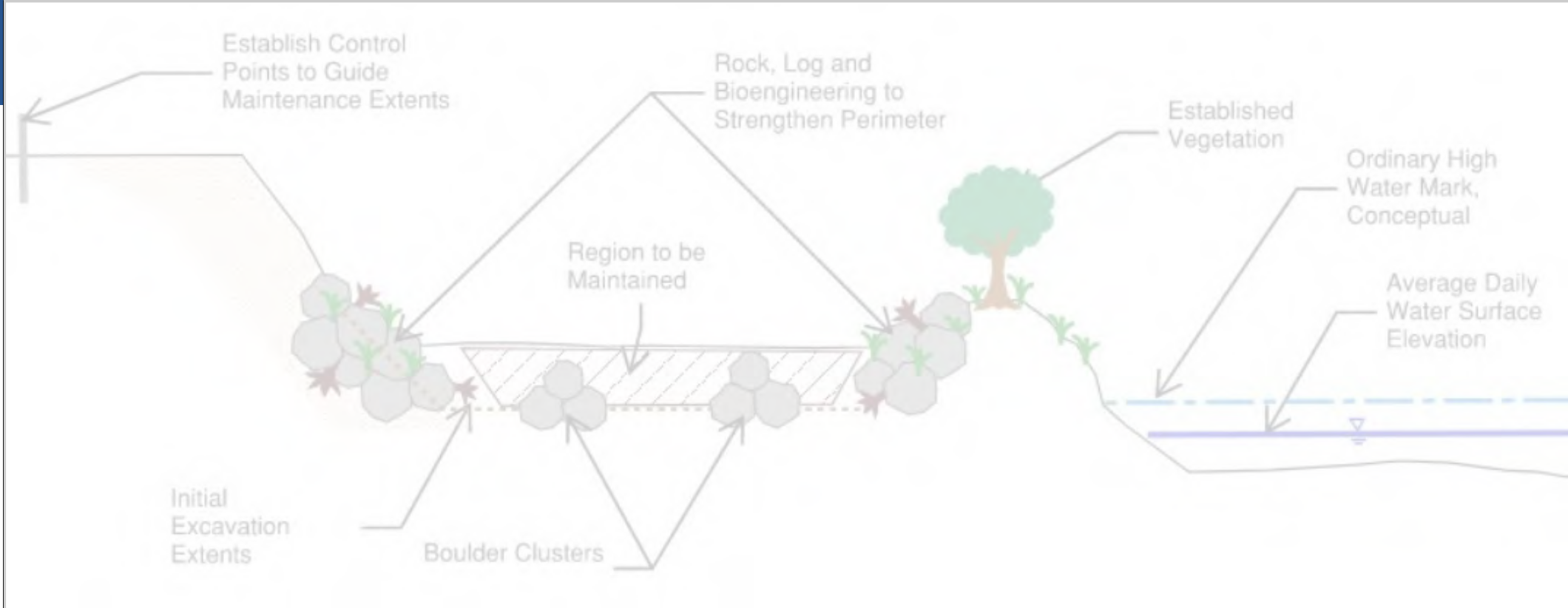
- Analyzed potential sites on East and West Forks of San Jacinto River
- Considered sand trapping efficacy and proximity to APOs
- Identified 3 finalist sites (all on West Fork)
- Site 004 recommended





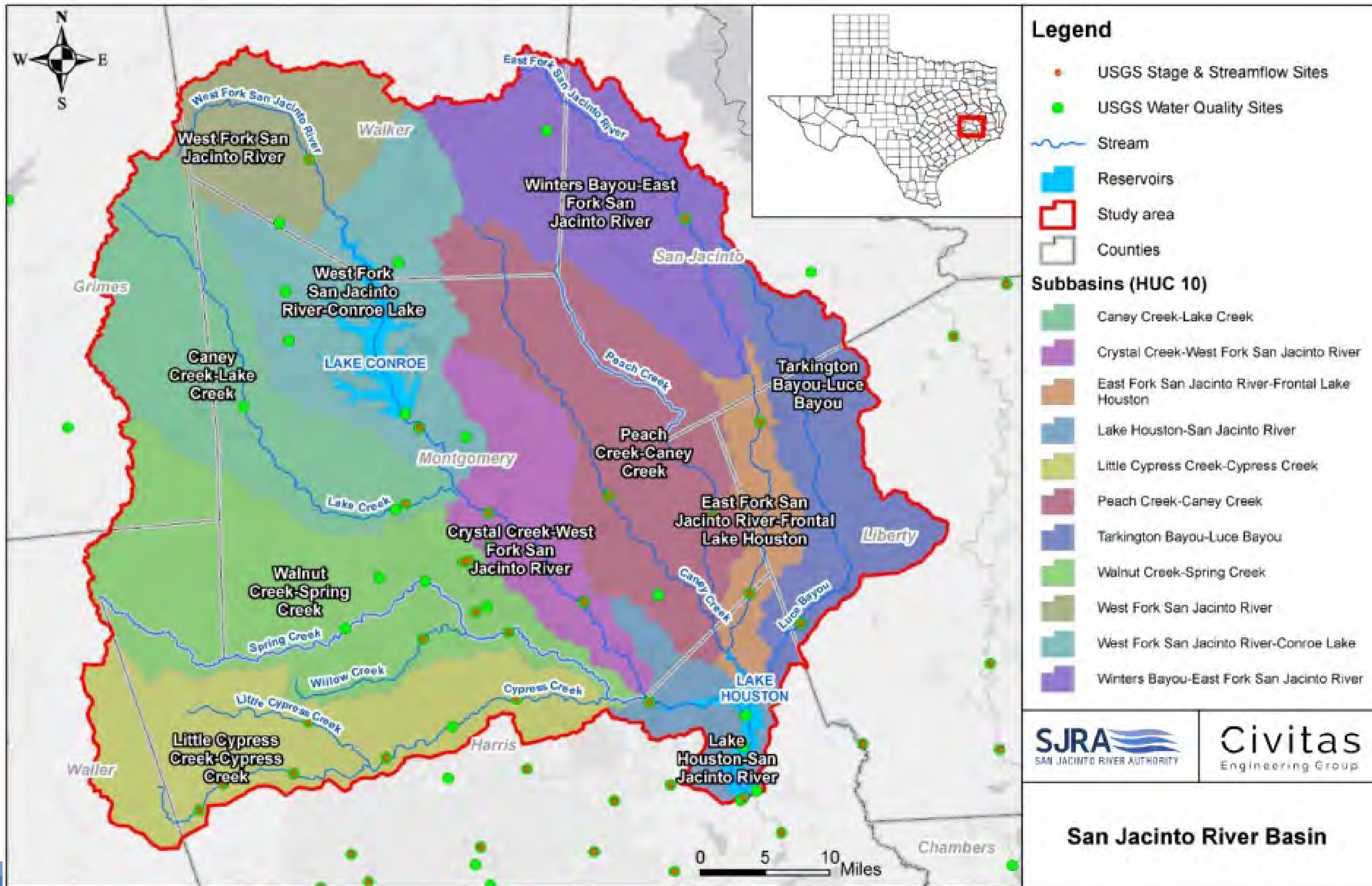


Out-of-Channel Trap

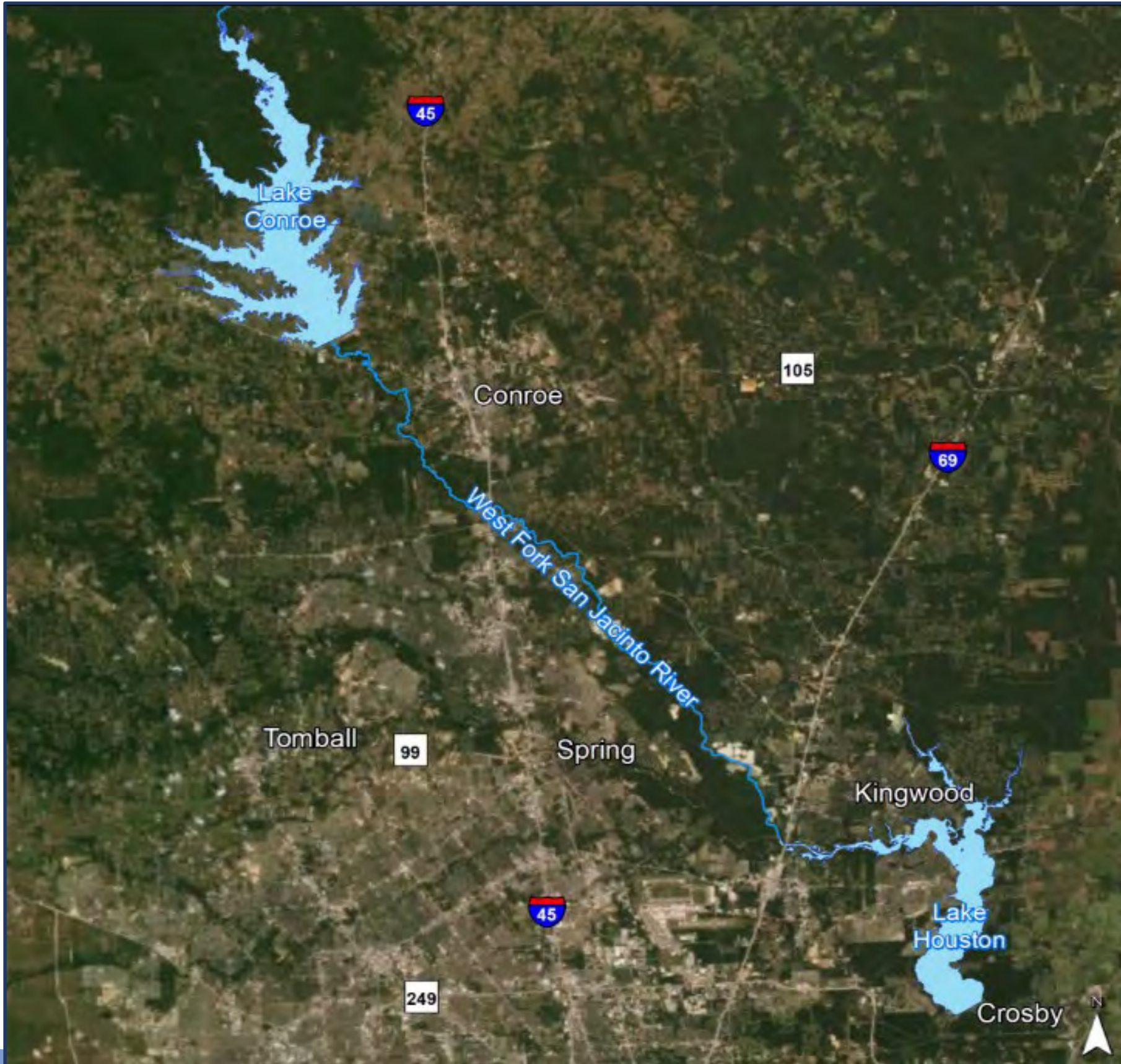

4 Primary Tasks:

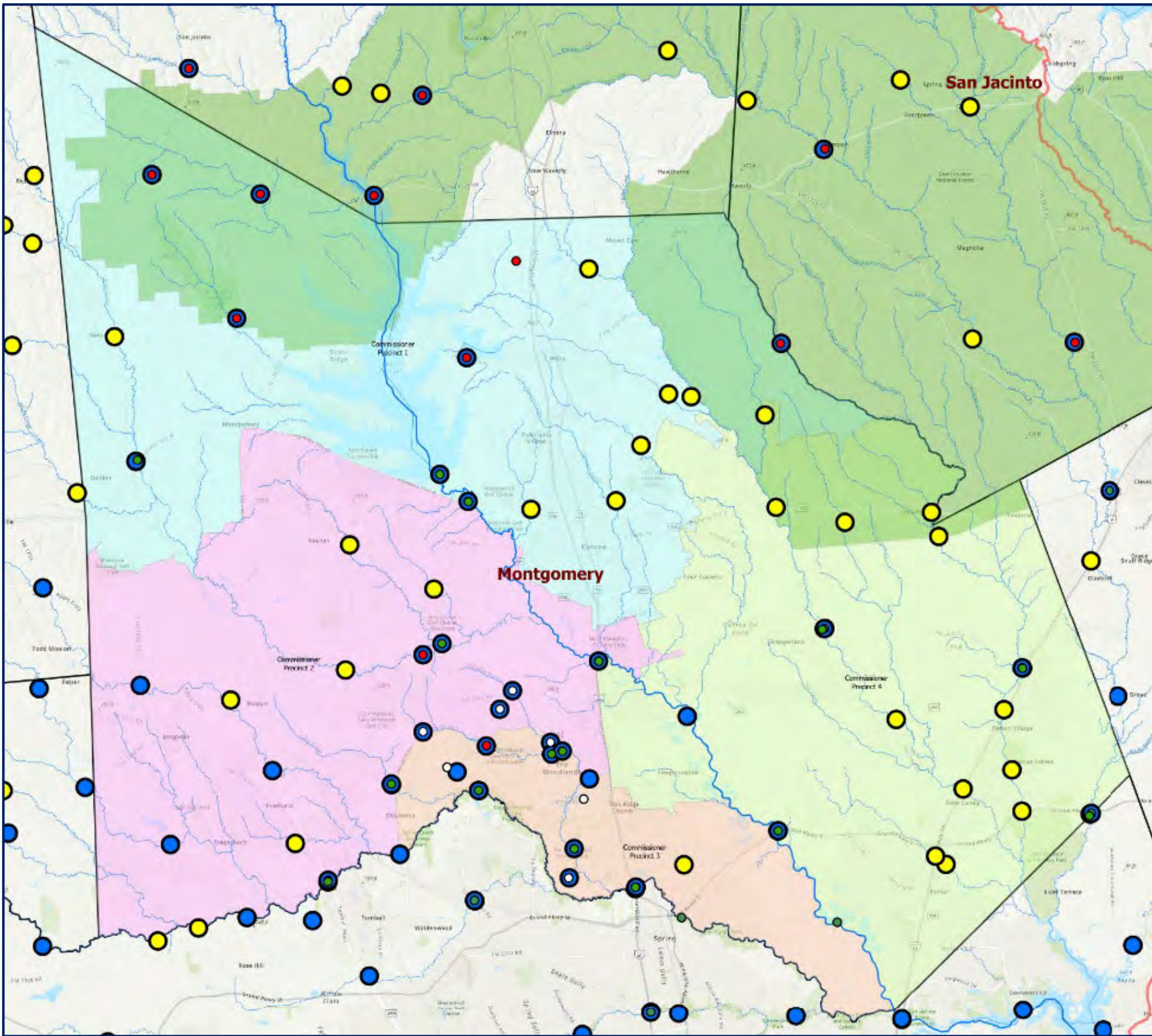
- Develop inflow forecasting tool for Lake Houston

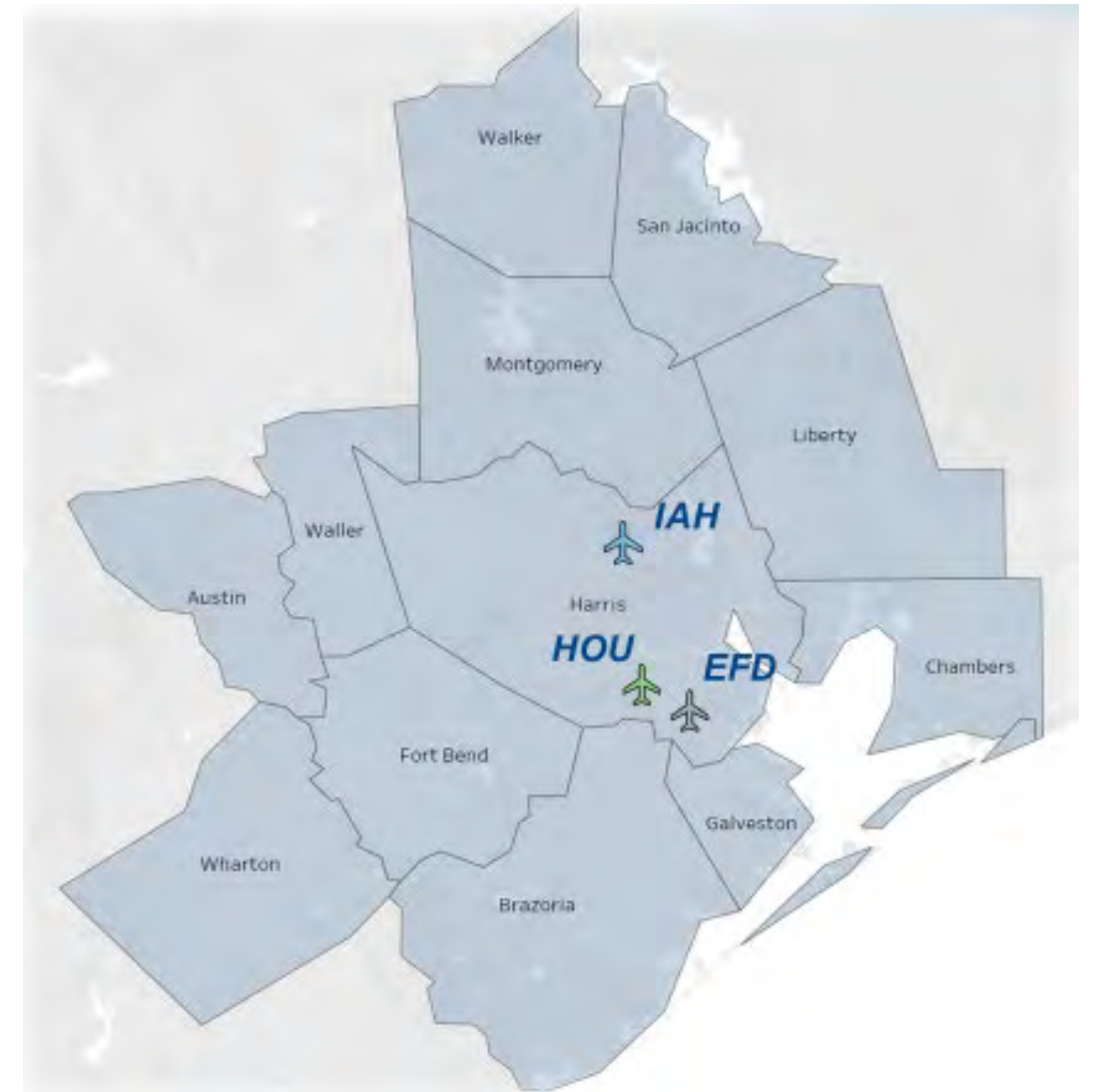

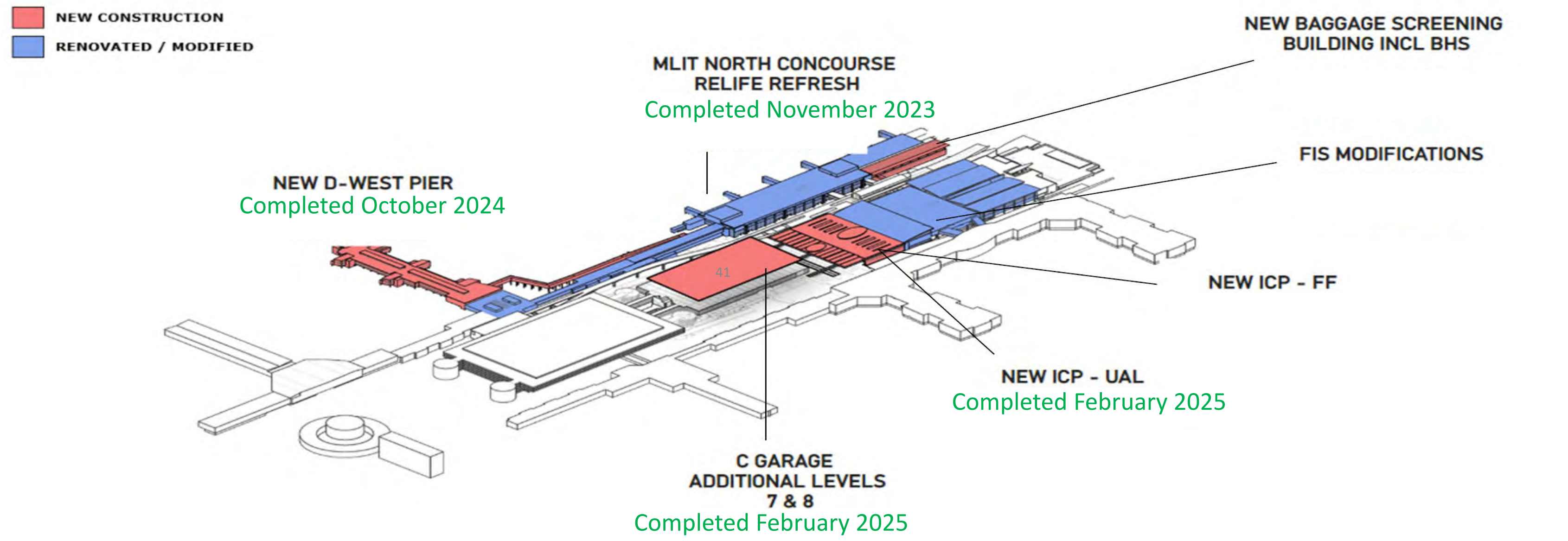
- Cargo-related output is reported separately from HAS Output, as it reflects off-airport cargo attributed to HAS activity.

Improvements | IAH Traffic

- Traffic eased significantly this summer
 - Severe traffic down 100%
 - Heavy traffic down 98%
- Passengers are noticing the difference
- Parking satisfaction has improved:
 - April 2024: +9 Net Promoter Score
 - June 2025: +33 Net Promoter Score

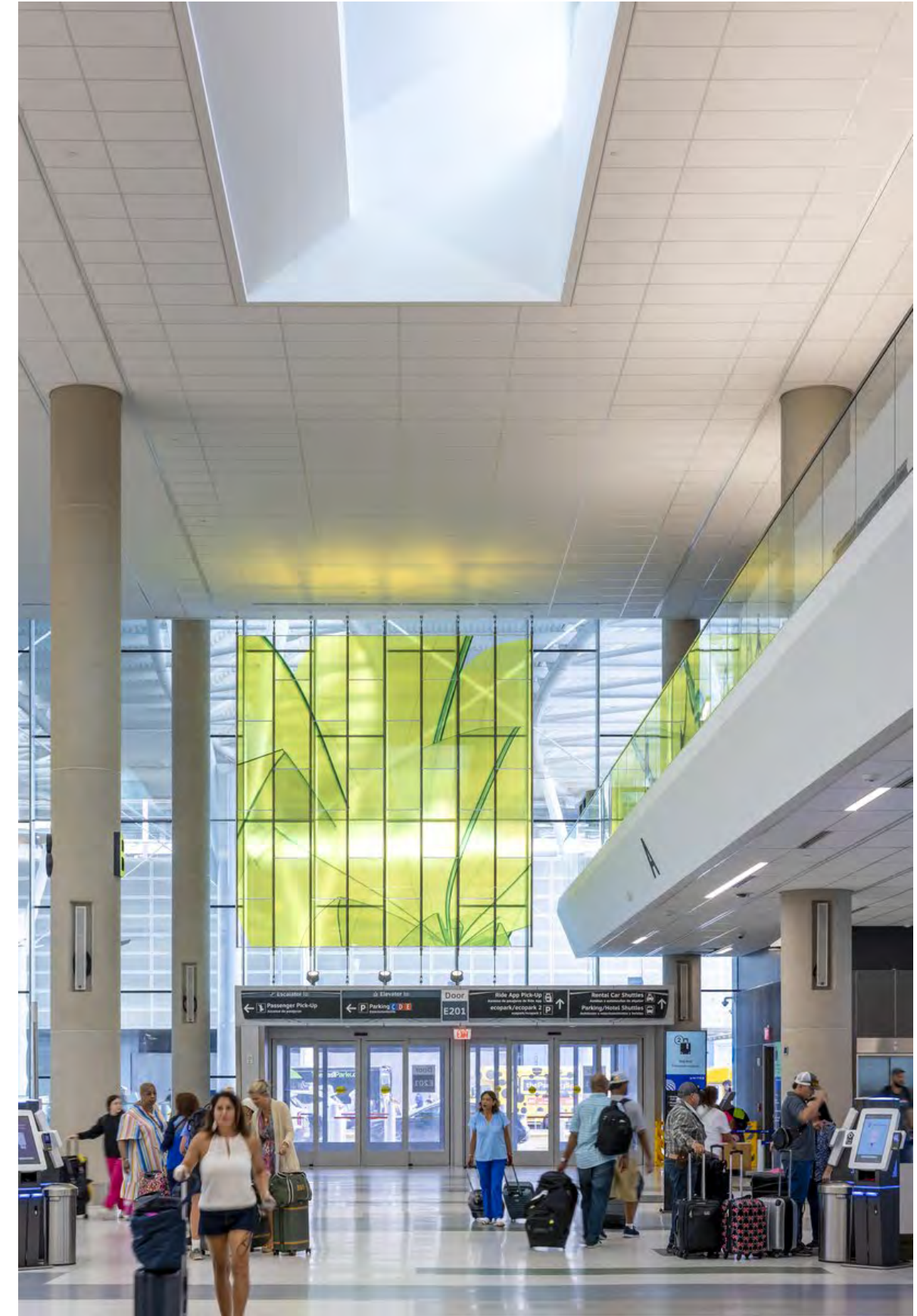

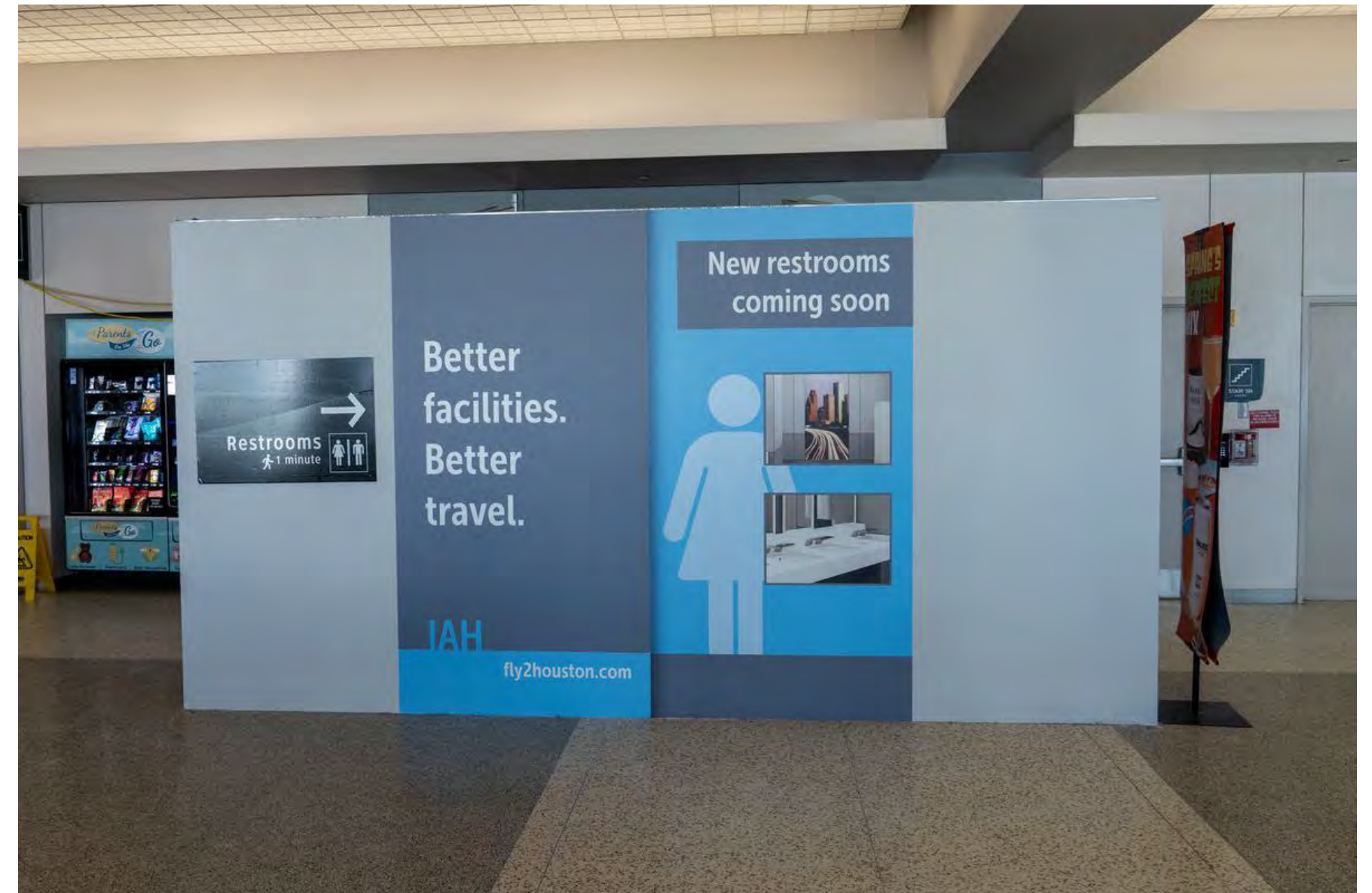

Kingwood Crime Year to Date 2025



Violent and non-violent crimes: DOWN ~15% YTD

Homicides, Human trafficking, kidnappings, or Greenbelt trail incidents: ZERO reported.

Auto theft and Burglaries: DOWN over 37% YTD

BMVs and Robberies: UP ~7% YTD





HPD-Kingwood Initiatives



Crime Suppression Team: Expedited case completions of numerous violent and nonviolent cases. Coordination with Harris and Montgomery County to arrest wanted persons.

Dogwood Street Clean Up: Coordinated with City of Houston to clean up trash. Also arrested several individuals for theft of electricity, illegal dumping, weapons, and drug offenses.

Traffic Enforcement: Data driven, combined with community concerns

Bike Patrol: Green Belt, apartment and business patrols.
